Reeds Lake is a 283 acre lake located within the City of East Grand Rapids. Despite heavy development, it remains a good fishing lake. The lake offers good largemouth bass, black crappie, sunfish, bluegill, yellow perch and northern pike.


The state record yellow bullhead (3 lb. 7¼ oz) was caught here in 1979.

The lake has been treated for carp in past years.

The public access site is located on the southwest corner in John Collins Park.

- DISPOSE UNUSED BAIT** on the land or in the trash
- EMPTY LIVEWELLS** and bilges at the ramp
- DISINFECT LIVEWELLS** and bilges with bleach solution (1/2 cup / 5 gallons of water)

- BOWFIN** - Bait: worms
- BLACK CRAPPIE** - Bait: minnow
- JIG**
- LARGEMOUTH BASS** - Bait: minnow; Lure: little spoons, jigs, surface lures, tubebait, crank baits, plastic worm; Mouth extends beyond eye

- INVASIVE COMMON CARP** - Bait: doughballs, worms
- CRAWLER HARNESS**
- YELLOW BULLHEAD**
- NORTHERN PIKE**
- LARGE SPOON; DAREDEVIL**

The **ROUND GOBY** is here. This aggressive invasive species is a threat to native fish their habitat and reproduction. The goby is easily caught with a hook and line. **DO NOT THROW IT BACK ALIVE!**
