

Adult Soccer Rules & Regulations

Slide tackling: Indirect free kick issued when outside the penalty area.

Due to injuries Slide tackling is not allowed by Field players in any EGR Adult Soccer league. Violators will be issued a yellow card if the slide tackle is performed next to an opponent. Players will sit out for a total of 3 to 5 mins on the official's discretion. Goalkeepers can dive; however, if a goalkeeper's feet make contact with the player on offense then the slide will be treated as if the goalie was a field player and will result in an automatic yellow card.

Indirect free kick

Is awarded if a player plays in a dangerous manner. Impedes the progress of an opponent without any contact being made.

Slide tackling: Direct kick issued when inside the penalty area.

Penalty kicks occur whenever a player commits a foul in their own penalty area. Several fouls would cause penalty kicks, including handball fouls and many physical penalties. Illegal contact like charging, pushing, tripping, and tackles result in penalty kicks.

A **penalty kick** is a method of restarting play, in which a player is allowed to take a single shot on the goal while it is defended only by the opposing team's <u>goalkeeper</u>. It is awarded when a foul punishable by a <u>direct free kick</u> is committed by a player in their own <u>penalty area</u>. The shot is taken from the penalty mark, from the goal line and centered between the touch lines.
