

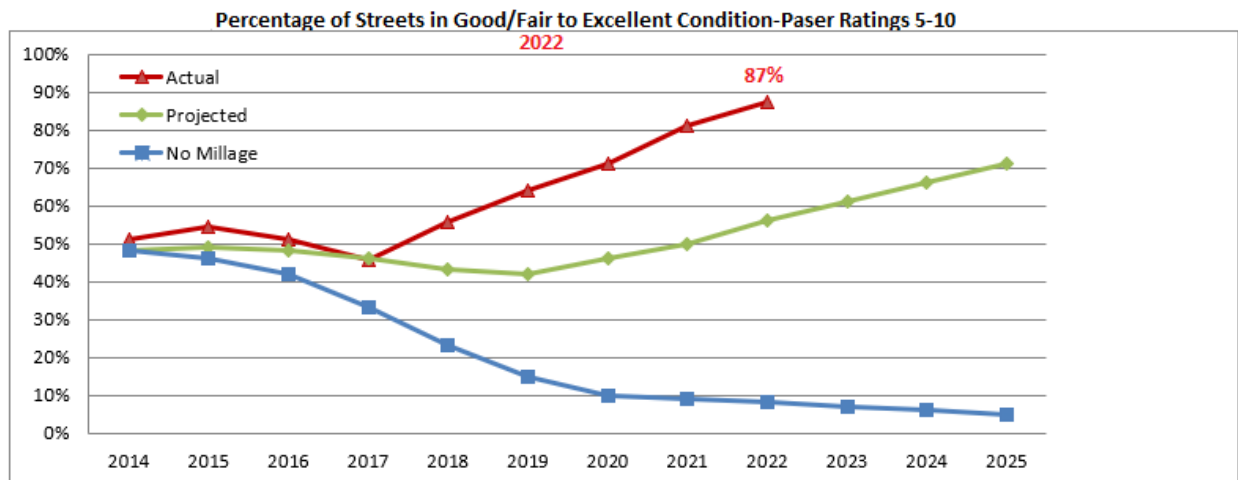


2022 Construction Recap

The EGR Public Works Department is committed to improving the approximate 50 miles of streets and 80 miles of sidewalks in the community. Thanks to a voter-approved millage, Public Works has successfully maintained and improved City street surface conditions since 2015.

City infrastructure enhancements continued in 2022, which resulted in a higher-than-expected PASER rating with **87% of City streets rated as fair-excellent**. This latest pavement condition rating is well above the projected 56%. The 2022 ratings demonstrate tax dollars are critical to the success to street and sidewalk improvements.

The graph below details the 2022 PASER ratings:



Thanks to the 2015 millage and water and sewer rate investments, the City has accomplished the following in 2022:

Street Construction:

- Mill and overlay: 2.04 miles
- Cape seal: 1.97 miles
- Sealant preservation: 1.07 miles
- Total: 5.08 miles
- Investment total: \$1,217,000

Sidewalk Rehabilitation and Replacement Program:

- The City utilized \$150,000 of the 2015 streets and sidewalk millage dollars to rehabilitate and replace City sidewalks in targeted areas.
- In 2022, the targeted area was west of Breton Road to the west city limit and from Elmwood Drive north to Hall Street.
- Approximately 545 feet of new sidewalk was constructed on the southside of Robinson Road from Briarwood Avenue to Plymouth Road with special assessment designated funds for new sidewalk and private contributions totaling \$33,000.
- The City also replaced sidewalk throughout the community based on reported concerns that meet rehabilitation or replacement criteria.



Utility Infrastructure Improvements:

Water Main Projects

- Rehabilitation of 3,050 feet (entire system stretches approximately 53 miles)
- 1% moving from level 5 rating to level 1 rating (PACP Asset Management Rating)
- Investment total: \$608,100

Sanitary Sewer Projects

- Rehabilitation of 3,392 feet (entire system comprised of approximately 42 miles)
- 1.5% system improvement from level 5 rating to level 1 rating (PACP Asset Management Rating)
- Investment total: \$120,000

Storm Sewer Projects

- Rehabilitation of 1,142 feet (entire system comprised of approximately 39 miles)
- Placed 918 feet of new storm sewer
- 1% system improvement from level 5 rating to level 1 rating (PACP Asset Management Rating)
- Investment total: \$142,000

Mobility-Bike Action Plan:

A Mobility-Bike Action Plan as was noted as a goal in the 2018 City Master Plan. A final plan was approved in 2021 that was reflective of community priorities and input from public engagement opportunities, surveys, and public hearings over the past few years. In July 2022, the Mobility-Bike Action Plan Implementation was approved. During the summer and fall of 2022, all short-term projects and select mid- and long-term projects were completed to provide a safe and connected network of cycling facilities within the City and adjacent communities.
